


A visual thinker of tender thoughts






Picture book project - 2023





A small project I'm doing to keep myself motivated and interested in the art of slow living. Children are surprisingly wise and intutive when it comes to enjoy real happniess.
















JAMIE & AUGUST Published children's book - 2013


